New Law Will Recognize High School Graduates Who Demonstrate Proficiency in Multiple Languages

On July 31, 2012, Governor Cuomo signed into law a bill to recognize New York State high school graduates who demonstrate academic excellence in attaining proficiency in one or more languages other than English with **a state seal of biliteracy**. The seal will be attached to diplomas and transcripts of graduates who excel in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in multiple languages.

The purpose of the seal is to increase students' future employment prospects and educational success. The New York State Commissioner of Education will award seals according to regulations developed by the Board of Regents. The bill will take effect September 1.
