Support for a Growing Need

Since 1987, RBERN has proven to be **an invaluable resource for our ELLs and MLLs** across New York State.

As of 2020, there are an estimated **256,736 ELLs/MLLs in New York State.**

That number is growing – fast. Over the past five years, there has been an **18.2% increase in the number of ELLs/MLLs in New York State.**

RBERN offers regional expertise that allows **immediate response to educators and students** in the field.

RBERN collaborates with BOCES content specialists to build cross-content **resources that support teachers with ALL learners**, as well as ELLs/MLLs.

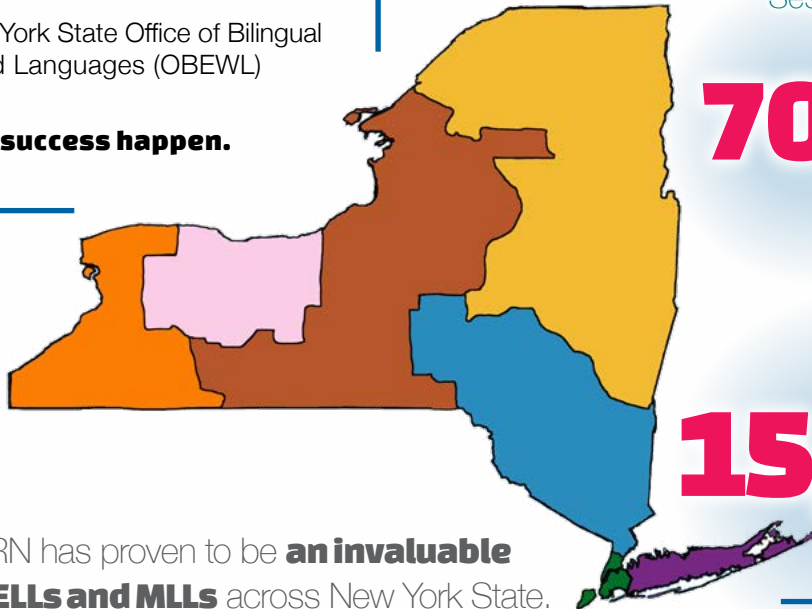
